Finance Volunteer Report

In April 2019 I joined the MS Society Guernsey Branch as the new Finance Volunteer following the retirement of Jeremy Home. I was very warmly welcomed by the other volunteers and I quickly realised how hard-working and dedicated the Team carry out their work.

There is a lot that goes on behind the scenes by way of raising funds of which all goes towards the cost of various services that the MS Guernsey Branch provides locally to our members. We currently ascertain that at the very least £20,000 is required annually to cover those costs and to raise those funds demands a lot of hard work for the volunteers, and generosity from the local community.

During the period January to August of this year we have already received £34,000 by way of fund-raising either by our Volunteers, 3rd party Fund raising, general donations and members' subscriptions. Donations from Corporate bodies have also been very gratefully received and various firms have raised funds from Dress-Down days.

Get to know our new Support Officer: Jo Grimshaw

I spent an idyllic childhood on Herm, where I lived with my parents and 5 brothers and sisters and where I enjoyed an unconventional primary school education, after which I headed off to the UK to complete my education at various boarding schools.

Having completed my secondary school education, I trained as a paediatric and general nurse in London and Jersey, married David, a Jerseyman and moved with our two sons, Sam and Oliver to New Zealand for ten years during the 1980s. While in New Zealand I continued my nursing career and studied as a mature student at Massey University in New Zealand attaining a degree in psychology.

We returned to the Channel Islands at the end of the 1980s and I worked for 14 years as the sister in charge of the PEH before taking early retirement to fulfil a long held ambition to do Humanitarian work overseas. I studied at the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine to get a qualification in Tropical Community Medicine and Health. My first assignment was in an acute clinic in the Darfur region of Sudan during the genocide of Darfur. Later I was sent to South Sudan to be the medical co-ordinator of a health programme – setting up health facilities in the North of the region. My next assignment was in Myanmar where my role was to assess an existing programme and advise on how to move it forward. My most recent mission was in Sierra Leone, during the ebola crisis, where I managed an ebola treatment centre.

When I am in Guernsey, I work on the nurses bank at the Guernsey Cheshire Home, where I am one of the RGNs – I work about 2 days a week, which leaves space in my life for some voluntary work, so when Linda asked me if I would take over from Alex as the grant support officer I felt that it was something that I could add to my otherwise busy life. My experience at the Cheshire Home has given me some knowledge and interest in MS. I have attended courses run by the MS Trust.

Any spare time I have is spent on various hobbies, swimming, gardening, singing or playing any one of my three musical instruments: the organ, piano and piano accordion.
