### Chair's report – May 2019

Well what a year it's been so far!

We started off in February with the Rowathon organised by Mark Windsor. This year the event was moved to February to try and improve uptake and didn't it work well! We had 17 teams entered and couldn't have fitted any more on the concourse. The support was fantastic as well and just over £5,500 was raised.

Then a slight lull until April, when we had 5 events! The quiz on April 4<sup>th</sup>, Flag days on April 6<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, publicity at the GFC match on April 22<sup>nd</sup> and WOW on April 24<sup>th</sup>. All these are covered elsewhere in this newsletter. Last weekend (May 11<sup>th</sup>) we had our AGM. This year we moved it to a Saturday and had it in the afternoon to see if this made it easier for people to attend. Even though it was a lovely sunny day, some 25 or so met in the Lihou room at the St Saviour's Community centre. After the AGM I gave a brief tour of our new website (very exciting – do have a peak!) and Gill has written more about this in this newsletter. Returning to the AGM, it would certainly seem that the afternoon is preferred and so we will probably stick to this idea. Thank you to St Saviour's Parish for permission to use their lovely facilities which we would also like to repeat please!

Events coming up include some form of social "get together" (e.g. Hog Roast or BBQ) probably in conjunction with the Parkinsons Disease Society to get enough people to get 'a good deal'. Details will be circulated as soon as finalised. Then there is the Lieutenant Governors fayre on Saturday July 20<sup>th</sup> at Government House from 12-4pm. This will be the first time we have participated in this event so DO come and support us. Any volunteers to help with the event will be most welcome. Contact Gill Ford (our secretary) if you can help.

We have been really overwhelmed so far this year by people offering to do spectacular feats/events for us. Mark Sinclair, a local teacher who is afraid of heights (!!!) did a Skydive for us in Jersey in March. Paul Robinson ran the London Marathon and put in a very respectable time despite being dosed up on lemsip and painkillers because of a nasty cold – see his comments on our new website under news (www.mssociety.org.gg). Ben de Jersey-Moore is going to be rowing a solo 100km row in Market Square on Thursday May 30<sup>th</sup>. He reckons it will take him about 8 hours so PLEASE come and encourage him – he will be starting at 08.00. Finally Richard Walker is doing a Skydive for us in August – watch the website for updates.

In addition to our new website and our Facebook page we now have a Twitter feed @MsGuernsey.

On the more strategic side, news on a second specialist nurse and DMT's. First the nurse; after several meetings between the Parkinsons Disease Society(PDS) and ourselves last summer, a reasonable Business case was prepared but lacked some Parkinsons Disease detail. The recruitment officer for PDS UK offered to help with this and add a bit to the Business case. This took a little longer than originally envisage and the revised proposal was only received back in the middle of April. We then had a meeting with States representatives on May 3<sup>rd</sup>. I am pleased to say that they agree that a second nurse is needed. Funding mechanisms are currently being discussed. At the time of writing I do not have a further meeting date. Regarding DMT's, you may be aware that at the December 2018 meeting of the States, Peter Roffey laid a Requete asking the States to provide all NICE (National Institute of Clinical Excellence) approved treatments to people in Guernsey to give us parity with the UK. The outcome of this discussion was a commitment by the Sates to look into this matter urgently

and report back by the summer. As a result the States employed a UK firm to write a report on the various options to achieve this. On behalf of MS I attended a workshop for Charities at the end of March. Whilst there are certainly reservations about the methodology used in parts of this

workshop, at least the conversations have started. With regard to MS however, the drugs that are NOT available (Abagio, Cladrabine and Ocrelizumab) are the ones with the highest rates of unpleasant side effects, hence requiring careful monitoring. This means not only having a second nurse, but also access to more MRI's (another scanner) and a neurologist on site, not just visiting. So we have made progress on the nurse; I need to approach HSC regarding proposals for Dr Oswald's replacement and we had better start saving some pennies towards a scanner – we'll get there, but it is still a bit of a way off yet.

Enough from me. Please come back to me with any questions or suggestions and in the meantime have a great summer.
